Sub: Recognition and temporary approval of affiliation of Institute of Law, Shri Jagdishprasad Jhabarmal Tibrewala University, Jhunjhunu, Rajasthan for imparting three year LLB with intake of two sections and five year BA LLB course with intake of one section.

Sir,

The Bar Council of India at its meeting held on 30th November, 2014 considered the inspection report of the above mentioned college. After consideration the Council decided as follows: -

The Bar Council of India examined the verification report submitted by the inspection team of the Bar Council of India. After consideration, the Council is of the view that so far non-law subjects are concerned, there are only two faculty members available in the institution, one for Political Science and another for English. As per rules for integrated course there has to be total four faculty members including English. Hence, the college to appoint two more non-law subject (Social Sciences) teachers within a period of three months. Approval is granted as per the recommendation of the inspection team. Intimation about said appointment should also be given to the Bar Council of India through affidavit.

In view of the above, as per Section 7 (1) (i) of the Advocates Act, 1961, Shri Jagdishprasad Jhabarmal Tibrewala University, Jhunjhunu, Rajasthan be granted recognition for the purpose of conferring the degree of law for imparting three year LL.B course and five year B.A. LL.B course and also granted temporary approval of affiliation to its Institute of Law, Shri Jagdishprasad Jhabarmal Tibrewala University, Jhunjhunu, Rajasthan for running two courses i.e. three year LL.B course with an intake of two sections of 60 students in each section and five year BA LL.B course with intake of one section of 60 students for a period of two years i.e. for the academic year 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 subject to the following conditions :-

1. The college management is directed to establish the Legal Aid Centre as per Clause-11, Schedule-III of Rule-11 of the Part-IV of the Legal Education Rules - 2008.

2. College should ensure the payment of salary to teachers as per Rules 22 schedule III, Part IV of BCI Rules.
3. The institution is directed to upgrade the library by investing minimum Rs. 50,000/- per year per stream.
4. Teacher Student ratio shall be as per Schedule-III, Rule-11, Clause-17, Part-IV of Bar Council of India Rules.
5. The University must create common room for running the legal aid centre separately.
6. The University must ensure that the attendance of the students should regularly be made.

Further, the books in the library seem to be very little. As per the rules of the Bar Council of India minimum requirement for library is hereunder. The college must follow this rule and invest Rs. One lakh if the college runs both the streams. The relevant Rule 15 of Schedule III of Legal Education Rules 2008 is given below :-

“Minimum Library requirement: To start with, a Law Library shall have a set of AIR manual, Central Acts and Local Acts, Criminal law journal, Corporate Law Advisor, SCC, Company cases, Indian Bar Review, selected Judgements on Professional Ethics and Journals with the back volumes for at least ten years and also such number of text books in each subjects taught during the period according to the minimum standard ratio of ten books for each registered students. For running integrated program, text books of such other subjects are also to be kept in the similar minimum ratio. The minimum investment in Library in each academic year shall be Rupees Fifty thousand for one stream and Rupees One Lakh for both the streams.”

College should also maintain the timing which has to be minimum 5 ½ hours with half an hour break. College to file an affidavit to the Bar Council of India within six weeks mentioning the timing of the classes. The relevant rules are quoted hereunder :-

Rule (xxiii), Chapter I

“(xxiii) “Regular Course of Study” means and includes a course which runs for at least five hours a day continuously with an additional half an hour recess every day and running not less than thirty hours of working schedule per week.”

Rule 5 of Schedule III

“Classes may be conducted between 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. in an Centre of Legal Education, which is not fully residential. However the Library may remain open till 10 p.m.”

Institution should submit affidavit in compliance to the above conditions within six weeks.

The University shall also comply with the following Rule of the Bar Council of India (Clause (iii) and Explanation 2 of Schedule IV in Part IV of new rules of the Bar Council of India):-

“Whenever approval of affiliation is granted to the Centres of Legal Education, it shall be necessary for the Centres of Legal Education to deposit Rupees Two Lakh in shape of guarantee to fulfil all the norms of the Bar Council of India. The same shall be liable to be forfeited if norms are not complied with and same shall carry no interest.”

The approval now granted by the Bar Council of India is subject to the payment of guarantee amount as mentioned in the above rule.

University authorities are also required to apply to the Bar Council of India for further extension of approval six months in advance before expiry of the period of approval of affiliation granted by the Bar Council of India i.e. on or before 31st December, 2015 failing which a late fee will be charged.

This is for your information and necessary action.
