EXAMINATION SCHEME AND DETAILED SYLLABUS

Political Science is a study of political world including organizations, their composition, public behaviour, philosophical foundations of each political aspect from individual to international setting. The study of theory and practices of Political Science prepares the students for lifelong politically aware, active and leadership in a democratic society.

PROGRAMME SPECIFIC OUTCOMES

The curriculum of Political Science will make the students able to:

- Understand the basic concepts of political science.
- Apply analytical research methods, description, interpretation and explanation of different aspects of political science.
- Analyze the interrelationship among the historical, political, economic, cultural and geographic dimensions of political science.
- Observe problems related to political science in an analytical and resolving attitude.
- Demonstrate substantive knowledge of concepts and facts pertaining to political scenario.

Scheme of Examination

The entire course will be of two years (four semesters). In Semester-I, there would be four Core Courses. In Semester-II, there would be five Core Courses. In semester III there would be four Core courses and in Semester-IV, there would be five Core courses.

1. The question paper shall contain ten (10) questions of 10 marks each. Student shall attempt any seven (7) questions.
2. For Internal Assessment (IA) of the theory papers: One Mid-Term Test of 15 Marks carrying five (5) questions, students shall attempt any three (3) questions and One Assignment of 15 Marks.
3. Passing Rules for M.A. (2 Years Course)

The result of a candidate will be worked out at the end of each Semester Examination.

For a Pass, candidate must obtain 40% marks for each theory paper and internal assessment.
