ORDINANCE NO. 34(A) LL.M .EXAMINATION

(1) General

(I)The LL.M. Examination shall be held in two parts called the LL.M. (Part I) and LL.M. (Part II) examination. The examination shall be open to regular students.

(ii) The LL.M. (Part I) shall be by written papers and LL.M.(Part II) shall be by four written papers and viva voce or by three written papers, one dissertation and viva-voce.

(iii) LL.M. degree course shall be spread over a period of One years viz., LL.M. (Part I) and LL.M. (Part II). Each LL.M. examination shall be divided in two terms viz., Summer Term and Winter Term which shall extend from January to June and July to December respectively. (v) Every candidate shall be examined in the subjects as mentioned in the scheme of examination and courses of studies for each term.

Scheme for Supervised Studies for LL.M. Examination

Section(1):(a)Subject to section3, a candidate shall be eligible to appear at the LL.M.(Part I) examination if after passing the LL.B. Examination of the University or of an Indian University recognized for the purpose by the Academic Council and has completed a regular course of study prescribed for the examination under a guide approved for the purpose by the Board of Studies in Law, in a Law Institute of the Vishwavidyalaya.

(b)Subjecttosection3,a candidate shall be eligible to appear a the LL.M.(part II)examination ,If after passing the LL.M.(Part I)Examination of this Vishwavidyalaya, has completed a regular course of study prescribed for the examination under a guide approved for the purpose by the Board of Studies in Law ,in a Law Institute of the Vishwavidyalaya.

Section(2): The qualifications of a person who may be approved by the Board of Studies in Law as a guide for LL.M. Studies shall be:-

Doctorate degree in Law ,or

- (i) LL.M. with at least three years experience of teaching LL.B. classes or
- (ii) Any other expert in Law who may be approved for the purpose in exceptional cases for which reasons shall be recorded.

Section(3): Every candidate who proposes to pursue LL.M. studies under an approved guide as provided in section-I shall apply to the Registrar with a fees decided by the university for registration as a candidate for LL.M. Part I or LL.M. Part II examination, the case may be ,by15th August preceding the examination ,or such last date as the President may approve and along with such applications submit the following:-

- (i)A certificate from the Head of the Department where he intends to pursue the studies that in case the candidate is recognized he will be allowed to study in the Institute Library, and,
- (ii)A letter from one of the guides approved by the Board of Studies in Law for the purpose expressing willingness to supervise and guide the studies of the candidate.

Section (4): This scheme will come into force withimmediate effect not with standing anything to the contrary contained in any other provision made in this behalf.

Rules of admission of candidates who have pursued regular course of studies.

(1)(a)A candidate who has passed the LL.B .examination of this Vishwavidyalaya or LL.B. or other equivalent examination of a recognized University shall be eligible to appear at the

LL.M.(Part I) examination, provided he/she has attended a regular course of lectures in a constituent college for a period of one year after passing the LL.B .or an equivalent examination.

(b)A candidate who has passed the LL.M.(part I)examination of this vishwavidyalaya shall be eligible to appear at the LL.M. (Part II) examination ,provided he/she has attended a regular course of lectures in a constituent college for a period of one year after passing the LL.M. (part I) examination and has also worked under a recognized guide for the same period before submitting his dissertation.

(II)Every candidate must register himself /herself as a candidate for LL.M.(Part I).(Part II) Examination in the Vishwavidyalaya with in 3months from the commencement of the session in which he/she wishes to appear at the examination and in case of LL.M. (Part II) Examination communicates the subject of his/her dissertation.

Section (5): In order to pass LL.M. Part I and II examination, a candidate shall have to secure at least 40% marks in each paper and 50% in aggregate in each term separately.

Section (6): A candidate failing in the Winter term will be allowed to prosecute his studies in Summer term and may appear in the Exanlination of either in two papers of Winter term or all the four papers of Winter and Summer term, but in both case she shall have to obtain at least 40% marks in each paper and 50% in aggregate in each term examination separately
